Highland Park 3rd Annual Picnic


October 9, 2010 from 12 noon to 2 p.m. on the empty lot on Lanarkshire Drive.

If you have a tree that needs to be replaced, Fritz Wurster (865-1556) will be happy to provide you with species and size specifications. For trees that are not replaced, the HPHOA will obtain competitive bids, replace the trees, and bill the applicable homeowner.



Covenant Highlight

Please keep trash totes out of sight and do not park cars on the streets overnight.

We are aware that the trash totes that Republic now uses for trash pick-up are quite large. If you have two regular totes and a recycling tote, you are wrestling for space for three totes in your garage. The covenants do require that trash cans-totes-whatever you personally call them, are to be placed out of sight in your garage. Please try to observe this practice to keep our neighborhood looking nice.

Also, the board has received several complaints this year about cars that are parked on the streets overnight. Not only can this be dangerous, but our covenants do state that cars are not to be parked on the streets overnight. Please move them to your driveway for everyone's safety.
